

Why did God create Adam and put him in the Garden of Eden?


Why do you think it was not good for Adam to be alone?

#### Your Creation



Now that we have looked at God's creation you are going to get the opportunity to create a living something of your own. You will be given a range of plants to create a small arrangement, however, you will have to provide the vessel that they are planted in. It could be a used Coke bottle, a plastic container, even an old shoe. Try to find something that is meaningful to you in some way.

After having planted your arrangement reflect on the process you undertook to create your "living creation."



As a class, go down to the Purtinga Wetlands and in small groups find a quiet place to reflect on the following questions. Share you answers with the class when you come back together.

What did you hear, see, and feel when you first got to your place for reflection?

What sort of interactions are you aware of around you?

Do you feel connected or disconnected to the natural setting around you? Explain your answer?

What sort of threats exist that could damage the wetland?

What do we need to do to minimize those threats?

How is this space a unique space on our campus?

Who is responsible for sustaining this place?

Imagine you are a frog or an insect living in Purtinga. What sort of things help you to thrive and what threatens your survival?

Can you define what a sanctuary is and would you consider Purtinga to be a sanctuary?

Can you see any similarities between Purtinga as a sanctuary for animals in the middle of Mount Barker and Earth as a sanctuary for us in the cosmos?



What is your class's definition for the word Shalom?


Where in the bible is Shalom achieved?
